BIBLE READING PLAN

## WEEK 1 REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. According to Psalms 1, how do you meditate on the Word day and night? What does that look like?
2. According to Psalms 2:7, who is talking about (see Acts 13:32-33)?
3. How are the New Testament believers encouraged by the Psalmists words (see Psalms 2:2/Acts 4:23-31)?
4. How did David respond when he had to flee his son Absalom (Psalms 3)?
5. What can we do differently in how we respond when we are betrayed by our loved ones?

## WEEK 2 REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. According to David in Psalms 4, what does David say to do and not do when you are angry?
2. According to Psalms 5, how does David wait for God?
3. Psalms 5:4-6, what does God do to the wicked/arrogant/deceitful?
4. In all the Psalms we read this week, what about God comforts you in trouble?
5. Psalms 8, what picture is David painting about God and our relationship to Him?

## WEEK 3 REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. Psalms 8:2 and Matt 21:15-16, what are the children saying as opposed to the chief priests?
2. Psalms 9:11, how are worship and witness related for David? Does your life reflect that?
3. Psalms 11:1-3, what advice is David being given? What question does David ask?
4. Psalms 11, what is David's response to his question?
5. In all the Psalms we read this week, are you distracted from enjoying God's wonders by the pursuit of "enemies"? Which of God's wonders brings back your focus to Him?

## WEEK 4 REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. According to Psalms 12, what is the bad communication that is happening?
2. In this communication battle, what is the Lord's response?
3. What are David's three stages of emotions in Psalms 13?
4. When you are in the 1st stage that David was in, what did David do that will help you to get to the last stage?

## WEEK 5 REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. Psalms 16:8-11 and Acts 2:25-28,34-35, do you think David understood how this prophesy would be fulfilled?
2. Referring to Psalms 17, on what basis do you plea before God: your integrity? The heartlessness of enemies? God's love? Or something else?
3. According to Psalms 18, this Psalm appears in 2 Samuel at the end of David's life. How is this Psalm a summary of his life?
4. David hid from Saul during his life in caves and behind rocks. How does this picture help you feel about God?
5. Knowing what David was going through during Psalms 18, how does it help bring meaning to your life?
