Americans have a unique understanding of freedom that began as freedom from tyranny and has morphed over decades to various forms of license and self-indulgence. As followers of Christ, however, freedom must be found in the framework of His word, independent of the teachings of the world.

The liberty Christ offers is not philosophical or political; rather, it is a spiritual liberty. It is rooted in the person and work of Jesus Christ himself, and He explains this during a brief exchange with some of His opponents in the Gospel of John. He starts with a conditional statement, "If you remain in my word, you are truly my disciples" (8:31). This suggests a co-participatory relationship. Just as the Father remains in Jesus (14:10), so must a disciple remain in Jesus and He in them. Thus, remaining in the word is to remain in intimate relationship with the Word (the work and person of Christ). If this condition is met, then Jesus presents an assurance in the next verse. "Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (8:32). Truth...here is another word that has morphed over time. In this postmodern world, truth is often defined as what you believe to be real based on your experiences and perception. This, however, would not have been the understanding of Jesus or those around Him when he taught. The Greek word used for truth here is alétheia, which in this context is defined as the truth of reality or divine truth revealed to man. The truth, to be known here, is the salvation and justification Christ offers through His ensuing death and resurrection. With this truth comes freedom, but what freedom is to be had? His opponents had the same question as they pointed out they



are "...the seed of Abraham and...have never been enslaved to anyone" (8:33). Many today may feel similar, but Jesus authoritatively responds "...everyone who sins is a slave to sin" (8:34). Let that sink in for a minute...we know that we are all sinners (Romans 3:23); therefore, Jesus is saying that we are a slave to sin. Sin is a divide or separation from God. It is a fracturing of the relationship that God intended Man to have with him in the garden. Thus, human self-centered, broken hearts are a slave to sin with no means of restoring the relationship on their own.

But...God always had a plan! As Jesus points out in verse 35, the slave is not a permanent member of the household, but "...the son remains forever." Jesus, the Son, can offer adoption, release from enslavement, and permanence in the household. Through His death on the cross as the ultimate sacrifice and defeat of death through His resurrection, the Son offers freedom... freedom from the tyranny of sin, liberation from self-interest, and restoration of relationship with the Father! Therefore, if you have been set free by the Son by grace through faith, "...you are free indeed" (8:36).
