

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Season of Comfort

Another holiday season has ended and with it ends another year. As we look back over the past decade, we likely see how the seasons of our lives have changed. In my own life I see seasons of learning, stepping into the unknown, turmoil, sadness, illness, healing, and joy. Often, I see a bit of several seasons at once (much like weather in Oklahoma). Ecclesiastes 3 tells us there is a season for everything on earth, then goes on to list these seasons. In this list, I noticed two seasons not included; a season of giving and a season of comfort.

When we look at the life of Jesus, we see he gave up the comfort of home and became a traveler who went from town to town teaching. He wasn't comfortable when he prayed until his sweat was drops of blood, or when he was mocked and ridiculed. He wasn't comfortable when he had to carry his cross, and he certainly wasn't comfortable when he died on that cross. Yet, with all of these discomforts, he never stopped giving. He gave his time to teaching others, gave his power to healing, gave his compassion freely, and He gave us salvation by dying. Jesus gave everywhere he went, even when it wasn't comfortable.

Just as children become uncomfortable when they outgrow their old shoes, we might find it uncomfortable when we grow in our relationship with God Romans 8 tells us we have been given gifts, and the parable of the three servants warns that our gifts will be taken away if not used. But how do we know what our gifts are? I believe this may be in the same way we find shoes that fit. We try on different sizes, styles, and options; stepping out of what is known, venturing into the unknown. When I was first asked to teach, I laughed...but now, I can't imagine not working with CCY's amazing kids.

If we look at giving as God does, as an act of love, we will find that we are more able to give than we realized. Acts of love are rarely financial; they most often take only a small amount of time and have larger impacts than we can imagine. The act of listening to another when they need someone to talk to, the shoulder you lend when someone needs to cry, the prayer you offer for others (even if they don't know you did). These are ways of giving that we can do everyday. Other ways of giving include helping with a ministry at church, where there is always a need. Many ministries are shorthanded, often with members serving in multiple roles. Being comfortable is not a requirement; in fact, if you're comfortable in your current giving, then it just might be time to make a change!
