# FINANCE REVIEW

## MESSAGE FROM OUR FINANCE ADMINISTRATORS

As you all know, during these precarious times, the Federal Government came out with the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act. (CARES Act). This includes the individual stimulus checks and the Payroll Protection Program (PPP). The PPP is a forgivable loan fully guaranteed by the Federal Government, to be administered by the Small Business Administration and a local bank.

Even though we are not having services at the church during these times business must go on IE: streaming sermons, worship, bible studies on line, and providing ZOOM for meetings and small gatherings. We are continuing to keep in touch, encouraging and helping our congregation. Of course, bills still need to be paid; commitments to our missions must be met and keeping the accounting records up to date.

CCY, as a church, is exempt from paying both federal and state unemployment taxes. Therefore, we felt we should apply for the PPP to enable CCY to continue to pay our staff for all the work they are doing behind the scenes to keep CCY viable.

On April 16, 2020 we were granted this forgivable loan in the amount of \$36,800.00. This money is strictly to be used to cover payroll and will not be combined with our general fund. Kathy Stanka and I are keeping a special file on the PPP monies and records of payments for payroll. On June 15th we will have to show this proof that the money was used strictly for payroll. At that time the loan will be forgiven. We will have to pay 1% interest for the use of this money.

We also applied, through the SBA (Small Business Administration) - EIDL Program - COVID-19
Economic Injury Disaster Loan) for additional assistance offered to qualified entities. On May 4,2020, CCY was granted \$7,000.00 under this Program, which is a grant and 100% interest-free. Some of these monies will be allocated for the purchase of supplies in connection with the reopening of CCY on May 17, such as several gallons of hand sanitizer, dispensers, social distancing reminder signs, markers for seating in our sanctuary, masks, internet upgrades to continue on-line streaming of Sunday services for the near future and other expenditures as the need arises.

We pray you stay healthy and God guide us through these uncertain times.

# Christ's Closet

Several years ago, Shera told me that God was laying it on her heart to open a clothing ministry at the church. As we discussed it amongst ourselves and others, the excitement grew as we were anxious to see what God had planned. Fast forward several years, the ministry has been the hands, feet, and love of Jesus by helping countless families in need, serving thousands of meals, providing school supplies, and giving families the opportunity to celebrate Christmas when it might otherwise not have happened. All of this has been made possible by your partnership in this ministry. It is by your donations of clothing, funds, and time that this ministry continues to thrive. Without you, it would not have the impact it has in the community.



About this time last year; however, it became obvious that the ministry had outgrown the dedicated rooms in the south building. We began to discuss the future of the Closet and what needs we had to ensure it continues to be as effective as possible. An immediate need became apparent... we needed more storage. The two rooms dedicated to the Closet and storage were busting at the seams, and it was nearly impossible to manage the resources unless the Closet was open. Sorting during the week was a challenge because the donations, racks, and bins had to be removed to be utilized. Several questions came to mind...How much storage did we need? What would it look like? How could we afford it?

The answer was a storage container. How could anyone be excited about a storage container you may ask? This large rectangular box would allow for the proper storage and management of the donations received for the closet. Sorting would be easier and help could be easily provided whenever the need arose. Plans were discussed for funding the project. Some mowers no longer needed were sold, and the money received was dedicated to the project. A fund-raiser lunch would be held in the spring to raise additional funds. It looked like it was a go, then the craziest thing happened...a "pandemic". Everything got put on hold.

That is where you come in again... Your faithfulness in giving has provided the church with the ability to continue ministry even in this challenging time. It was suggested that maybe now was the time to move on this project while things had slowed. Financially, the church could handle it knowing that we would still have a fund-raiser lunch at a later date to offset the cost, so the decision was made to go ahead. With the help of several amazing servants - Mike Knight, Sam Minick, Bill Denison, and Mike Slifer – we now have a storage container on the west side of the south building.

The new container will allow the ministry to grow for years to come. It will have space for storage of both off-season and current donations as well as a work area for sorting and organizing. Our prayer is this ministry will continue to impact lives for Christ through providing basic necessities opening the door to conversations about the most crucial necessity – Christ. Thank you! Thank you for your partnership in this ministry. Thank you for your faithfulness to God's vision for our church, and thank you for your prayers, help, and donations to this ministry.
