In light of recent events, I think we could all use some stress relief! You may not know it, but I love the study of Hebrew words. Biblically, they have so much more meaning than our plain ol' English.

Yom Kippur is known to us as the Day of Atonement. In the Torah, it is written in the plural: Yom Ha-Kippurim, most likely because of the multitude of our transgressions and sins. Back in the day, the process of atonement as described in Leviticus 16, took away the sins of an entire nation. This sin offering was a shadow of Him – our loving Messiah. In Hebrew the sin offering is called Khataah or Chata'ah, which has a double meaning; (1) sin offering and (2) sin. This means that in order for the Messiah to take away our sin, He had to become sin itself. 2 Corinthians 5:21 tells us, "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." The sacrifice and the sin bear the same name! Sacrifice bears the name of the sin and the sin bears the name of the sacrifice that takes away the sin.

Messiah is your Khataah – your sin and your savior. Every sin bears His name and every one of our sins belong to Him. Once confessed, our sins no longer belong to us. We must be careful that we don't take them back, as this would be an act of theft! Give to Him that which belongs to Him, that which already bears His name. Let it go and be relieved of the guilt and stress of your sins!
